SUBJECT: Amendment 5 to Connecting Kentuckiana 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan

(MTP) and the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

KIPDA staff are ready to present Amendment 5 to the committee for consideration. The complete project listing, air quality conformity analysis and Interagency Consultation (IAC) meeting minutes can be viewed in the Amendment 5 packet here:



Sponsors were given until December 15, 2023, to submit project changes. This is a full amendment and includes a mix of 30 exempt and non-exempt project updates. The public comment period was open for 15 days from January 24, 2024, to February 7, 2024, including a hybrid open house from 5-6 pm on January 31, 2024.

Greg Burress will send the public comments to the Transportation Policy Committee (TPC) members on February 8, 2024, as part of their 15-day review.

SUBJECT: KIPDA Performance Management Plan (PMP) Safety Targets Update

FHWA requires that the MPOs that have chosen to set safety performance measure targets specific to their region, do so on an annual basis. The set of five safety performance measures are collectively referred to as PM I. More specifically, the five measures that FHWA prescribes are:

- Number of Fatalities
- Fatality Rate
- Number of Serious Injuries
- Serious Injury Rate
- Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries

MPOs are required to submit updated baselines and targets to their respective State DOTs for each of these five measures by February 27th. These baselines and targets are required to be presented as five-year rolling averages. A baseline for each measure has been established for the five-year period from 2017-2021. Proposed targets for each of the five measures reflecting 2019-2023, the methodology for establishing these targets, as well as a summary of 2022 crash data in the KIPDA Region will be discussed at the meeting.

SUBJECT: TTCC Working Group

KIPDA staff is in the process of updating the Project Management Guidebook (PMG).
