# **Review and Approval of TPC Minutes**

# **Public Comment Period**

One comment requested adding a ramp from Dupont Road (behind Norton Medical Plaza) to the I-64 ramp to the I-264 (Watterson Expressway) to relieve congestion from Dutchmans Lane to Breckinridge Lane (KY 1932) to the Watterson Expressway.

The other three comments requested that safety concerns along East Broadway due to speeding be addressed by adding additional bicycle and pedestrian facilities along with other traffic claiming measures on Barrett Avenue, Shelby Street, Logan Street, and Broadway.

SUBJECT: 2025 Transportation Policy Committee Officers

Per the TPC bylaws, the highest-ranking officer of the KIPDA Board from the urbanized area who is also a member of the TPC serves as chairperson of the TPC. If the chair is declined by such officer of the KIPDA Board, or if the chair otherwise becomes vacant, the TPC shall recommend by a two-thirds majority vote of members present, provided a quorum exists, a chairperson to the KIPDA Board for approval. Board approval will install the selected chairperson in office.

Jack Coffman Clark County Commissioner is the highest-ranking officer of the 2025 KIPDA Board and has accepted the role of TPC Chair. Nominations for the vice-chair were discussed by the TPC nominating committee prior to the TPC meeting and that recommendation will be announced along with any other nominations.

SUBJECT: Indiana Quarterly Meeting

KIPDA staff held the winter Indiana quarterly meeting for MPO-dedicated project review. One of the primary topics of discussion was what to do with the remaining \$1,960,073 of FY25 funding now available with the failure of the Mt. Tabor Road project. The group recommended providing TARC \$100,000 (federal) to partially fund a planning study for a potential downtown transit center and give an additional \$25,000 towards Clark County's planning study for their proposed Memphis Blue Lick Road project. The remaining \$1,835,073 will be put towards a yet to be determined INDOT project located within the KIPDA region.
