**CALL TO ORDER**

Mr. Logsdon called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

## **MINUTES**

Mr. Couch moved to approve the minutes from the February 27, 2025 Regional Transportation Council (RTC) meeting. Judge Bates seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Mr. Logsdon stated that there were no public comments.

## **SHIFT SPONSORSHIPS**

Mr. Logsdon provided the Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) project lists for Henry, Shelby, Spencer, and Trimble Counties and the Council reviewed the projects to decide which projects to sponsor.

Council members from Shelby County applied their ten project sponsorship allocations according to the local rankings.

Council members from Spencer County applied their seven project sponsorship allocations according to the local rankings.

Judge Bates applied the five project sponsorships that were allocated to Henry County according to the local rankings.

Judge Ogburn and Mr. Couch applied the five project sponsorships that were allocated to Trimble County to the following projects:

- Realignment of US 421 through Milton between the Milton-Madison Bridge (MP 18.78) and extending south to reconnect to the existing US 421 near MP 15.45
- Improve safety and address geometric deficiencies along US 421 from 400 feet north of Martini Lane to 0.8 miles south of KY 316
- Construct pedestrian facilities along US 42 from Ball Lane to Trimble County Public Library and MP 7.3
- Improve safety and reduce congestion on I-71 from the Henry/Trimble County line to the Trimble/Carroll County line
- Address sight distance and substandard curve issues on KY 754 between MP 1.42 to MP 1.62 to improve truck access

These sponsorships were made in addition to the four projects in Henry County, six in Shelby County, four in Spencer County, and three in Trimble County that were sponsored by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC).

Judge Ogburn moved to approve the sponsorship allocations. Deputy Judge Park seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

### **SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL UPDATE**

Mr. Logsdon stated that the second Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) survey is ongoing. There have been a lot of responses from Shelby County, some from Henry County, one from Spencer County, and none from Trimble County. KIPDA Transportation Division staff are currently working on an implementation grant for Trimble County for a sidewalk installation from the high school to the elementary school and repairing some other sidewalks in Bedford.

The window for Implementation Grants is now open; however, the catch is that this grant requires a large minimum project size. There is a \$2.5 million federal share, which would mean the total project cost would have to be \$3.125 million. With the state matching pool, there would be a 5% match for Shelby and Spencer Counties, 3% match for Henry County, and a 2% match for Trimble County.

Anyone interested in applying for an Implementation Grant should contact Mr. Logsdon for assistance. The pre-application deadline is May 9.

### **COUNTY TRANSPORTATION UPDATES**

#### **Henry County**

Judge Bates reported that Henry County experienced a lot of damage to roads due to the recent flooding. Most of the roads that were damaged were county roads but one was a state road. One major problem has been the mud left on the road surfaces after the flooding that causes slippery conditions each time it rains.

#### **Shelby County**

Deputy Judge Park stated that the new construction being done on I-64 has created a situation in which a cut through has been closed off. This is a concern for emergency vehicles that may need to turn around on the interstate. Any help that KYTC can provide to improve this situation would be very much appreciated.

### Spencer County

Judge Travis reported that he was thankful that the 1633 project has been completed. Also, the county has experienced some flood damage. One road cracked open and slipped towards the creek it runs along. There are a lot of ditches that need to be cleaned and culverts that need to be repaired.

Magistrate Travis added that there were many downed tree limbs after the recent storms, but the county has gotten most of them cleaned up.

### Trimble County

Judge Ogburn reported that the county has had several roads damaged by flooding and is in the process of getting them cleaned up. One road has been shut down and the county is still waiting to get the repairs done on it, and there was some pretty major damage done to 441. Also, 3175 Bedford Sulfur Road is nearly finished being paved.

### **OTHER BUSINESS**

The next Regional Transportation Council meeting will be held on Thursday, August 28, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. in KIPDA Conference Room A and via Zoom video conference.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

Deputy Judge Park moved to adjourn the meeting at 1:49 p.m. Magistrate Travis seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.
