SUBJECT: Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A)

KIPDA staff would like to inform all stakeholders that the consultant team in conjunction with KIPDA has officially completed its **Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Comprehensive Safety Action Plan** for the KIPDA MPO region, developed in alignment with the U.S. Department of Transportation's SS4A grant program. This marks a critical milestone in our ongoing efforts to reduce roadway fatalities and serious injuries and advance toward a **Vision Zero** goal.

The SS4A program, established through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, supports local governments in developing and implementing strategies to improve transportation safety. Our region was awarded an **Action Plan Grant** in 2023, and work began shortly thereafter to create a holistic, safety-centered plan grounded in the **Safe System Approach**. The completed Action Plan positions us to apply for **Implementation Grant funding**, opening the door to federally supported safety projects designed to address our highest-risk corridors and intersections.

# Highlights of the Completed Plan

- **Data-Driven Analysis:** Identified high-crash locations and contributing risk factors using local and regional data over a period of five years.
- **Community Engagement:** Engaged with hundreds of residents and stakeholders through meetings, surveys, and public forums, with help from local stakeholders to reach the most urban and rural corners of our communities.
- **Safety Strategies:** Recommended a range of interventions, including traffic calming, complete streets redesigns, pedestrian safety upgrades, and speed management strategies.

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- **Partnerships:** Developed implementation frameworks in collaboration with schools, transit agencies, and law enforcement.
- **High Injury Network:** Established a high injury network to prioritize certain segments and intersections of our roadway network for safety improvements.

Upon adoption of this SS4A Action Plan for the KIPDA MPO region, we will begin preparing to apply for the next SS4A Implementation Grant opportunity that likely will open in spring 2026. We will continue to involve the TPC, TTCC, and other community stakeholders as we work towards this goal.

Also, we would like to give sincere thanks to all city/county staff, consultants, stakeholders, and community members in all of the KIPDA counties who contributed to this process. Your collaboration and commitment have created a strong foundation for safer streets for all.

This amendment includes a revision to the Chapter 7 - Air Quality Status subsection of FY25-FY28 TIP. The Interagency Consultant Group (IAC) and KIPDA staff reviewed the TIP revision draft and project updates on July 15, 2025. Sponsors were given until June 20, 2025, to submit project changes and 41 project updates were submitted.

A public comment period was open for 15 days from July 29, 2025, to August 12, 2025, and included a virtual open house on August 6, 2025, from 5-6 pm. Greg Burress sent the public comments to the TPC members on August 12, 2025.

The Technical Coordinating Committee (TTCC) voted to recommend approval of the amendment draft on August 13, 2025.

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The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) and Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) will be notified of the change following the final federal approval to make the necessary STIP updates.

SUBJECT: KYTC SHIFT 2026 Process

On August 8<sup>th</sup>, a Working Group of the KIPDA Transportation Technical Coordinating Committee met to select 18 projects to boost for the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet's Strategic Highway Investment Formula for Tomorrow (SHIFT) Process. The boosting process allows for local input to provide additional points to a select number of projects as the 2026-2032 Highway Plan is developed.

The working group's task was to select 18 of the approximately 91 projects they had to choose from to boost. The list of projects eligible for boosting consists of the projects that were sponsored by KYTC or by the KIPDA TPC earlier this year.

The list of 18 projects recommended by the Working Group for the TPC to boost, along with a list of all the projects under consideration to boost will be posted online after the meeting.

KIPDA staff will discuss Administrative Modifications 2 and 3 to the FY25-FY28 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), also listed as Administrative Modification 27 and 28 to Connecting Kentuckiana 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP).

Administrative Modification 2 was sent to TPC members on 07/29/25 and to KYTC and INDOT Staff notifying them of the required STIP updates on 07/31/2025. Administrative Modification 3 is included in this packet and is planned to be sent to KYTC and INDOT for STIP updates following this meeting.

Qualifying criteria for administrative modifications include the following actions:

- Correcting minor data entry errors.
- Splitting or combining projects without modifying the original project intent.
- Changing or clarifying elements of a project description (with no change in funding). This change would not alter the original project's intention.
- Moving a project from one funding category to another.
- Shifting the schedule of a project or phase within the years covered by the STIP/TIP (with no impact to fiscal constraint).
- Adding Planning, Design, ROW or Utilities phases to a construction project that is already included in the STIP.
- Updating project cost estimates (within the original project scope and intent) which do not
  impact fiscal constraint and updating the estimated total project cost in the MTP when
  applicable.

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• Adding projects that are considered "grouped projects" that do not require public review, redemonstration of fiscal constraint, or a conformity determination.

These modifications are presented for your information only. The changes do not affect the fiscal constraint of the TIP or progress of other projects in the program.
