Description:	Replacement of Bridge 51 over Silver Creek and reconstruction of approaches on Blackiston Mill Road. Total project length is approximately 0.312 miles.				
Justification:	The proposed replacement bridge will be approximately 250 feet long, with 700 foot approaches. Bridge 51 carries Blackiston Mill Road over Silver Creek and currently serves as a critical link between the City of New Albany and the Town of Clarksville. The bridge structure itself is the responsibility of Floyd County, with the northern approach being in the City of New Albany and the southern approach in the Town of Clarksville and Clark County. In our 2018 Bridge Inspection Report, Bridge 51 scored a 39.2 Sufficiency Rating.

Justification:	<p>I-64 (Riverside Expressway) was constructed in the late 1960s and early 1970s. This added to the already-existing separation of the community from the riverfront created by the U.S. Army of Corps of Engineers floodwall and levee system and the railroad lines that run along and near the Ohio River.</p> <p>This project will identify barriers to and opportunities for community connectivity and will develop alternative concepts to improve connections to and from the Ohio Riverfront. The project will address all modes of transportation.</p>

Description:	Building off the Preston Corridor Plan and Logan and Shelby Street two-way conversions, this project will study and develop traffic calming, safety, and connectivity improvements in the Shelby Park and Smoketown neighborhoods with a focus on safety near schools and parks.				
Justification:	The Preston Corridor Plan identified traffic calming and connectivity as important considerations in Shelby Park and Smoketown. In addition, the nearby two-way conversion of Logan and Shelby Streets will create new traffic patterns in the neighborhood. A comprehensive network analysis that takes into these considerations and changes will will result in important safety improvements for all street users. A \$2.4M federal Community Project Fund grant, plus a local match, have been allocated for this purpose.
