**A. Ohio River Valley Northeast (ORVNE) Trail  
(KIPDA File No. K6-2026)**

The applicant is requesting \$640,000 in Federal funds and \$160,000 in local funds for the construction of a trailhead/parking lot, and a signed/marked crossing to the existing Lewis and Clark Greenway Trail. This construction project is part of the larger Ohio River Valley Northeast (ORVNE) 5-3036.0 project that is described as follows: Design and construct an accessible shared-use path system, including amenities, that connects the Lewis and Clark Bridge to US 42 in Prospect, KY. This corridor is approximately 2.5 miles of the 100+ mile Louisville Loop.

This project is needed for a safe gathering, mobilization, and connection area to the existing Lewis and Clark Greenway Trail and to the future Ohio River Valley Northeast (ORVNE) 5-3036.0 Louisville Loop.

**B. Herr Lane Widening Design Project - Wesboro to Graymoor  
(KIPDA File No. K7-2026)**

The applicant is requesting \$250,000.00 in local funds for the design (and ultimate construction) of a three-lane section of Herr Lane (KY 2050), between Wesboro Road and Graymoor Road, approximately 2250' in length (0.43 miles). This design section is being funded by Metro Department of Transportation utilizing local funding. This design section will connect to a future three-lane section (from Graymoor Road to Westport Road - KY 1447) that is being designed as part of KYTC's 5-80200 project. Both projects include a two-way left turn and the addition or upgrade to a 5' sidewalk on both sides of the roadway.

This design section is part of the overall Herr Lane Corridor Improvement project needed for safety and enhanced operations due to the forthcoming opening of a new Veterans Administration (VA) Hospital. The corridor is also extensively used for through traffic connecting Westport Road to KY 22, KY 42, and I-264.



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**C. Harmony Village Road Water Main Extension Project**  
**(KIPDA File No. K8-2026)**

The applicant is requesting \$526,580.00 in state funds for the installation of 2,275 linear feet (LF) of 6" PVC water main along Harmony Village Road in Oldham County. This project will extend potable drinking water service to eleven (11) unserved residences in Oldham County.

The Louisville Water Company provides retail service to a portion of Oldham County. Some areas in the Louisville Water Company's Oldham County retail service area are underserved or do not have water service available. Harmony Village Road is an unserved street. This project will bring domestic potable drinking water and fire protection to eleven (11) residences in this area.

**CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Summers called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

**ROLL CALL**

Executive Director Haley called roll and stated a quorum was present.

**WELCOME**

Chairman Summers welcomed and thanked everyone for attending the meeting.

**MINUTES**

Mr. Griffee moved to approve the Board of Directors Meeting Minutes from November 24, 2025. Judge Ison seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

**NOVEMBER FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

Ms. Winkfield Shaw provided the following update for November 2025.

The Summary of Elements shows that the Community and Economic Development (CED) Division spent a total of \$324,517 for 11.36%; the Transportation Division spent \$1,300,433 for 26.26%; and the Division of Social Services spent a total of \$18,067,692 for 46.92%. The Agency's other operating costs were \$8,829 for 3.79%. The overall KIPDA total was \$19,873,251 in expenditures through November 30, 2025.

The Agencywide Line Item Revenues and Expenditures shows that the current revenue was \$4,269,605; the year-to-date revenue was \$20,524,026; and the revenue percentage was 44.09%. Current expenditures were \$4,105,127; year to date expenditures were \$19,837,251; and the expenditure percentage was 42.61%.

The Balance Sheet shows the Agency's cash balance was \$3,695,644 for 20%; total receivables were \$2,802,170 for 15%; other assets were \$2,937,062 for 15%; and total liabilities and projects were \$9,435,556 for 50%.

Mr. Griffee moved to approve the report. Judge Ison seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

## **DECEMBER FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

Ms. Winkfield Shaw provided the following update for December 2025.

The Summary of Elements shows that the Community and Economic Development (CED) Division spent a total of \$437,165 for 15.3%; the Transportation Division spent \$1,576,605 for 31.83%; and the total spend of the Division of Social Services was \$22,666,463 for 58.86%. The Agency's other operating costs were \$8,974 for 3.85%. The overall KIPDA total was \$24,849,934 in expenditures through December 31, 2025.

The Agencywide Line Item Revenues and Expenditures shows that the current revenue was \$5,175,031; the year-to-date revenue was \$25,699,057; and the revenue percentage was 55.21%. Current expenditures were \$5,012,682; year to date expenditures were \$24,849,934; and the expenditure percentage was 53.38%.

The Balance Sheet shows the Agency's cash balance was \$3,774,067 for 19%; total receivables were \$3,100,736 for 16%; other assets were \$2,935,097 for 15%; and total liabilities and projects were \$9,814,565 for 50%.

**REGIONAL WATER MANAGEMENT COUNCIL**

Mr. Carter reported the KIPDA Regional Water Management Council held their Fiscal Year 2026 3rd Quarter meeting in the Burke Room and virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, January 13th from 1:30 – 2:30 PM. There was a quorum with no attendance issues, and the Council approved the Minutes from our October 14th, 2025, meeting.

Arianna Lageman with the Kentucky Rural Water Association provided the Council with drinking water updates and information regarding new Lead and Copper Rule Improvements. The updates have recently set a new lower action level of 10 parts per billion and mandates the replacement of all lead service lines within 10 years, requiring water systems to inventory, find, and replace them, improving public health protection significantly over previous rules, with compliance starting in the beginning of 2027.

Ellie Wellman and Casey Cash with the Bluegrass Area Development District also joined us as guest speakers. They presented their Bluegrass Regional Water and Wastewater Rate Book. Our Regional Water Management Council showed interest in having KIPDA Community & Economic Development Division staff begin a similar rate study for our KIPDA Region water and wastewater systems sometime in 2026.

### **MANAGED IT SERVICES RFP**

Ms. Jennifer Wahle, Network Administrator, reported her upcoming retirement. Due to the nature of today's labor market, the agency has decided to explore Managed Services as a possible replacement. KIPDA released an RFP at the end of December, and responses are due on January 29th.

A committee of six staff members will make their initial evaluations between January 30th and February 4th and choose which vendors to call back for a presentation.

The presentations will take place from February 5th through February 13th. Final recommendations will be made to the Executive Committee during the week of February 16th. The contract will be awarded by February 20th.

Ms. Wahle asked the Board to ratify the RFP that was released in December and give approval for the Executive Committee to consider staff recommendations and award the contract prior to the February Board Meeting. If a contract is awarded, the agency will request ratification in February.

Judge Travis moved to approve the request. Judge Coffman seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

### **INTERGOVERNMENTAL REVIEWS**

#### **A. Flatlick Road Water Main Extension Phase I (KIPDA File No. K30-2025)**

The applicant, City of Mount Washington, is requesting \$182,000.00 in state funds, and \$32,400.00 in local funds to install 2915 feet of 8-inch water main and valves to residents that are on wells, having to haul water. This will provide water now and fire protections which will be provided later. This is also for future growth as there is a lot of undeveloped land.

#### **B. Bypass Lift Station Replacement Project (KIPDA File No. K31-2025)**

The applicant, Mt. Washington Sewer, is requesting \$1,815,000.00 in state funds to replace the Bypass sewer lift station which was installed in 1993. This is the main lift station supporting the entire east portion of Mt. Washington. It is crucial to the operation of the overall sewer system as eight (8) lift stations and numerous residential and commercial gravity lines serving the area run through it. All the associated valves, pumps, and electrical systems are original equipment. The lift station is approximately 20 feet deep and of the cannister type and is a safety hazard to perform bi-weekly operations and maintenance. Fans are required to run 24/7 and cool the soft start motors increasing electrical expense.

**C. Joe B. Hall Avenue Sidewalk Extension  
(KIPDA File No. K1-2026)**

The applicant, City of Shepherdsville, is requesting \$1,600,000.00 from Department of Transportation (DOT) and providing \$400,000.00 to extend sidewalk along Joe B. Hall Avenue from the rail crossing between Walnut Street and East Street to the entrance to the new aquatic center located approximately 2,400 linear feet along Joe B. Hall Avenue to the east. This will provide a dedicated facility to connect pedestrians to the aquatic center, between schools, and to planned park improvements.

**D. Milton City Park Trail Expansion  
(KIPDA File No. K2-2026)**

The applicant, Trimble County Fiscal Court, is requesting \$540,000.00 from Department of Transportation (DOT) and providing \$135,000.00 to complete the design phase for a 10-foot wide shared use path connecting an existing parking lot for Milton City Park located on Cross Street, running parallel to Cross Street to School Hollow Road, then running parallel to School Hollow Road to the North to KY36 and to the South to connect to an existing path at Spring Street. This will provide safe pedestrian and bicycle access to Milton City Park and expand its trail system to improve the quality of life of residents. The project would connect to a planned 10-foot shared use path along KY 36 to downtown Milton and the Milton-Madison bridge.

**E. Louisville Loop McNeely Lake Extension  
(KIPDA File No. K3-2026)**

The applicant, Louisville Metro Government, is requesting \$2,500,000.00 in Federal Funds and providing \$6,292,000.00 to extend the Louisville Loop at McNeely Lake Park from its current terminus for two miles through the park. This is a construction project that will actualize final design completed in 2025. Construction is anticipated to complete in September 2027. The Louisville Loop is the recreational backbone of Louisville and Jefferson County; this project will extend direct access to parks and green space via a trail extension that will promote exercise, recreation, and connections to nature. This project supports Louisville Metro's Louisville Loop Master Plan and will assist in reinvigorating public, municipal, and philanthropic interest in the Loop's expansion.

**F. CV 2026 CHDO Application  
(KIPDA File No. K4-2026)**

The applicant, Community Ventures' Community Housing Development Organization (CHDO) is requesting \$500,000 from Kentucky Housing Corporation in federal HUD HOME Investment Partnerships Program funding and providing \$761,618.00 to acquire, rehabilitate, and resell single family homes to households with incomes at or below 80% of the area median. No sites are selected at this time. The project is scattered, unspecified site (as income-eligible and creditworthy households are identified, CV assists them in finding a for-sale home on the private market that can be brought up to code and sold to the family at or below HUD's Homeownership Value Limits, which vary by Kentucky county). All acquired properties will have municipal or on-site water and wastewater, existing electrical access, and access to natural gas/propane/electric as required by the home's mechanical systems. CV will perform rehabilitation only; no new construction is proposed. Acquired homes will typically be 3BR and 1.5-2.0 baths, and average 1,300 S.F. Homes will be sold to households with incomes at or below 80% of area median. CV will provide \$153,930 in non-federal cash from its Bluegrass Housing Fund, and homebuyers will contribute \$500 per household (x 5 households). CV will use approximately \$605,188 of a \$2MM private bank line of credit for interim construction financing. This funding will enable CV to acquire, rehab, and resell five single-family homes to households with incomes at or below 80% of the area median (low-income households). The construction financing and permanent subsidy made possible with HOME funds will give families who otherwise could not afford to purchase a home their opportunity to be homeowners. Subsidy will be provided as necessary, up to a maximum of \$40,000 per home, to ensure that households' monthly payments are affordable.

**G. Beargrass Creek Park Section 6(f)(3) Conversion Project  
(KIPDA File No. K5-2026)**

The applicant, Louisville Parks and Recreation, is proposing a LWCF Section 6(f)(3) Conversion in Louisville/Jefferson County associated with prior LWCF Project Numbers 21-00579, 21-00673. In 2019, Louisville Parks and Recreation submitted a proposal to the Land and Water Conservation Fund for the Shawnee Park Section 6(f)(3) Conversion Project. Due to unavoidable impacts to recreational areas in Shawnee Park through the installation of a combined sewer overflow system by Louisville Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD), Bear Grass Creek Park was proposed as a replacement property, and is therefore bound by LWCF restrictions. The current LWCF project proposal involves the conversion of approximately 0.72 acre of Beargrass Creek Park, located near the intersection of Lexington Road and Grinstead Drive. It is

proposed that the conversion parcel be replaced with approximately 27 acres of predominantly forested land adjacent to Windsor Park in Louisville/Jefferson County. Approximately 0.21 acre of the conversion property at Beargrass Creek Park will be transferred to the adjacent property developer, JDG Triangle Partners, to accommodate the construction of infrastructure for the mixed-use development adjacent to the park. The remaining conversion area will be transferred and granted as public access and utility easement to accommodate the construction of a shared entrance with a new stoplight, road and walkway, and utility easement. The replacement property is currently owned by MSD, and will be transferred to Louisville Metro Parks. The replacement property will greatly expand the recreational area of the former Windsor Park, which will be renamed Nick Rodman Park. The improved accessibility provided by the addition of a stoplight will benefit the park and surrounding community. The replacement property adjacent to Windsor Park will be transferred from MSD to Louisville Metro Parks. The replacement property will increase the size of the park significantly, and will provide future recreational activities for the surrounding community. The expansion of the park will protect the environmental resources and biodiversity within the park.

Judge Coffman moved to approve the requests. Mr. Griffie seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.







HB2 MEDICAID (FLEMING, K) AN ACT relating to Medicaid, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Amend KRS 205.5371 to require the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to condition eligibility for enrollment or continued enrollment in the Medicaid program on demonstrated community engagement as required under federal law; require the cabinet to continue to condition eligibility on demonstrated community engagement if federal requirements are abolished, repealed, or otherwise diminished; amend KRS 205.6312 to require the cabinet and any contracted Medicaid managed care organization to impose cost-sharing requirements for Medicaid enrollees as required under federal law no later than January 1, 2027; establish minimum cost-sharing amounts; amend KRS 205.556 and 205.618 to conform; create new sections of KRS Chapter 205 to require the cabinet to, no later than July 1, 2026, begin conducting Medicaid eligibility redeterminations once every 6 months as required under federal law; require the cabinet to access and review certain data when conducting eligibility redeterminations; establish a process for identifying and, when appropriate, disenrolling individuals who are concurrently enrolled in the Kentucky Medicaid program and a Medicaid program administered by another state or states; amend KRS 205.178 to require the cabinet to receive and review information from the Kentucky Lottery Corporation, Department of Corrections, and the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation on at least a monthly basis, the Kentucky Department of Revenue on at least an annual basis, and the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet on a quarterly basis; require the Department for Medicaid Services to enter into a data sharing agreement with the Social Security Administration to receive the full file of death information on at least a quarterly basis; prohibit the cabinet from seeking or requesting an exemption or waiver from federal community engagement requirements related to county unemployment rates unless specifically authorized by the General Assembly to do so; amend KRS 205.5375 to require hospitals to assist presumptively eligible individuals in submitting a full Medicaid application; amend KRS 205.200 to prohibit the cabinet from accepting self-attestation of income, residency, or age for the purpose of determining eligibility for Medicaid or compliance with community engagement requirements; create new sections of KRS Chapter 205 to establish Medicaid managed care organization contracting requirements and penalties; establish the Medicaid managed care organization compliance fund within the State Treasury; establish that amounts in the fund not appropriated at the close of a fiscal year shall not lapse and shall be carried forward; prohibit the expenditure of funds in the account unless expressly appropriated by the General Assembly; require the Department for Medicaid Services to submit recommendations for use of monies in the fund to the Legislative Research Commission by November 1, 2027, and November 1, of each following odd-numbered year; amend KRS 205.533 to require Medicaid managed care organizations to include certain information for providers on their websites; amend KRS 205.534 to require managed care organizations to allow providers 120 days to file an appeal or grievance related to a reduction of denial of a claim; establish penalties for a managed care organization's failure to ensure the timely disposition of any appeal or grievance; require payment of any amount owed to a provider following an appeal to be paid within 30 days; require payments made following an appeal to include interest and reasonable attorney's fees; establish standards and requirements for provider audits; require the inclusion of additional information in the monthly report filed by managed care organizations; require the Department for Medicaid Services to submit an annual report to the Legislative Research Commission related to Medicaid claims, appeals, and grievances; authorize the Department for Medicaid Services to promulgate administrative regulations; create new sections of KRS Chapter 205 to establish requirements for administration of the Medicaid-covered nonemergency medical transportation services; establish requirements for the administration of 1915(c) Medicaid waiver programs; require the Department for Medicaid Services to develop and implement a tiered priority system for assigning 1915(c) Medicaid waiver program slots by January 1, 2027; require administration of Medicaid-covered dental services by an administrative service organization; establish that the administrative service

HB11 INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICTS (BAUMAN, J) AN ACT relating to independent school districts.

Create new sections of KRS Chapter 160 to establish a process for the creation of new independent school districts from a persistently underperforming school district; define terms; establish the process for a local legislative body where a persistently underperforming school district is located to place the question of creating new independent districts and local boards of education on the ballot; specify the requirements for the questions and the board of education provisional election; establish the initial terms of office for the interim board of education; establish the transition of authorities from the originating district board of education to the boards of both the altered originating district and the new

independent district; require the Kentucky Department of Education to calculate assets and liabilities of the originating district for division to the new independent districts; authorize the originating district to maintain control and use of assets until the scheduled transfer to the new independent districts and authorize the continued payments of debts; establish a negotiation process between the originating district and the new independent districts to resolve the division of the originating district's assets and liabilities; establish a deadline for the negotiation to conclude; provide a process for resolution of disagreements; establish a deadline for the transfer of all assets and debts; authorize the originating district to continue to assess and collect taxes for all districts until the close of the tax year in which the new independent districts are fully operational; provide for the distribution of collected taxes during the transition period; require the county judge/executive to call the newly elected interim boards of new independent districts to meet; allow the interim board to request assistance from the Kentucky Department of Education; establish the transition process for new independent districts to become fully functional; allow the interim board to submit a waiver request for a statute or administrative regulation to the Kentucky Board of Education; authorize the interim board to enter into service contracts with another school district during the transition; establish a process for the interim board to vote to terminate the establishment of the new independent district due to financial nonviability during the transition; establish the transition from an interim board to a fully functional board of the new independent district; require the continued collection of taxes restricted to the payment of debt or interest; waive the requirement for school-based decision making for the first year of operations of the new independent district; require the interim board of the new independent district to develop a transition plan and establish the requirements of the plan; create a new section of KRS Chapter 157, relating to state formula funding calculations, to establish a projection model for the first year of full operations of the new independent district and the altered originating district.

HB65 WEIGHT LIMITS ON STATE ROADS (HODGSON, J) AN ACT relating to weight limits on state roads.

Amend KRS 189.2226, regarding overweight allowances for hauling of building materials for homes, to require any builder of 10 or more homes in a 1 mile radius to apply for a permit before the person may operate under the exemptions; require all persons applying for a permit issued under this section to enter into a cooperative agreement with the Transportation Cabinet; allow the Transportation Cabinet to require a bond as part of the cooperative agreement; require funds collected under a cooperative agreement to be used for maintenance of state roads covered under the cooperative agreement.

SB213 RETAIL ELECTRIC SUPPLIERS (WHEELER, P) AN ACT relating to retail electric suppliers.

Create new sections of KRS Chapter 278 to declare that policy of the Commonwealth is for retail electric suppliers under the Public Service Commission (PSC) to procure electric generation sufficient to meet customer demand using an open, competitive process and at a rate that is the lowest possible; require retail electric suppliers to conduct integrated resource planning every 3 years and set forth the parameters of the integrated resource plan process; exempt elective cooperatives from the integrated resource plan process if the cooperative maintains an all-requirements contract; direct the PSC to promulgate administrative regulations within 120 days of the effective date of the Act; restrict the purchase of capacity from regional transmission organizations or independent system operators for prolonged periods as determined by the commission; require retail electric suppliers to file integrated resource plans on a triennial basis and include an assessment and acquisition plan for adequate and reliable electricity to meet customer demand at the lowest possible cost of forecasted estimates; make the privilege to serve customers in a certified territory a property right of the Commonwealth; require the PSC to allow the commission to determine an amount to be returned to customers of an electric retail supplier that is based on a calculation of the privilege to serve in a certified territory in a proceeding involving an acquisition, transfer, or sale of an electric retail supplier; allow one time, limited choice of retail electric supplier for incremental load at a single site in excess of 50 megawatts beginning June 30, 2027; require the PSC to ensure customers of affected retail electric suppliers are indifferent to the limited choice designation; amend KRS 278.010 to amend the definition of "adequate service" to include generating capacity; define "integrated resource plan"; amend KRS 278.016 to state that retail electric supplier has the privilege to provide electric service; amend KRS 278.018 to state that retail electric suppliers have the privilege rather than right to furnish retail electric service in its certified territory; and if the PSC find that a retail electric supplier is not providing adequate service the PSC may order the supplier to correct the problem; allow the commission to authorize another retail electric supplier to serve facilities located in the certified territory of another retail electric supplier; amend KRS 278.020 to determine whether public ownership of a retail electric supplier can achieve lower rates and deem cooperatives organized under KRS Chapter 279 to have public ownership; allow the PSC to consider the integrated resource planning process or the use of the contract when making a

determination on a certificate of public convenience and necessity; amend 278.300 to allow the for evaluation of the integrated resource plan or use of a contract when granting certificate of public convenience and necessity.


